RE: PRESIDENTIAL DIRECTIVE ON LOCKDOWN DUE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC – EXEMPTION LETTER

Following the directives of Mr. President to the Presidential Committee on COVID-19 and the Federal Ministry of Industry, Trade and Investment (FMITI) to ensure sustainable production and effective distribution of essential products throughout the period of the COVID-19 pandemic, I am pleased to inform you that FMITI has established an emergency operation center (as a coordination mechanism) with members drawn from the Ministry, Manufacturing and Road Transport sector to ensure that all key stakeholders namely:

- Manufacturers Association of Nigeria;
- Nigerian Association Chambers of Commerce, Industry Mines and Agriculture;
- National Association of Nigerian Traders; and
- Nigerian Association of Small Scale Industrialists amongst others are actively engaged in the process.

- 2. It is worthy of note that this measure is to help monitor the real time status of the transportation and delivery of essential goods with a view to cutting down on the difficulties been faced by manufacturers, transporters, and distributors of essentials commodities across the country.
- 3. In a bid towards identifying what constitutes essential commodities within the context of the COVID-19 pandemic as succinctly stated in Mr. President's address to the nation, our inter agency engagement with officials from Federal Ministry of Health (FMoH), National Center for Disease Control (NCDC) revealed that the listed items attached as appendix I can be classified under essential goods.
- 4. In order to ensure well guided, coordinated and defined rules of engagement in the course of moving these items, it is our hope that you will facilitate and ensure strict adherence to the following:
 - i. trucks are not allowed to convey passengers;
 - ii. the occupants must not exceed three (3) i.e. the driver, a spare driver and conductor; and
 - iii. Drivers must have basic protective and sanitary items including face masks, hand sanitizers and tissue paper to and from their final destination.
- 5. While appreciating your support and that of your members, please accept the assurances of my highest regards and consideration.
